Design plans for our Bond project are complete and our project team will receive the final bids this month. Construction is scheduled to begin immediately after school lets out. The first phase of construction, which will be completed over the summer, will include boiler replacement and remodeling of the front office, science rooms and upper corridors. Students and staff will return to school to find our front office has been made over to improve security by providing greater visibility and controlled access of the front door. A glass entry vestibule will be constructed which will allow the front doors to be seen from the reception desk. During the school day, all doors will be locked and visitors will be required to enter the building through the main office. Before this work can begin, asbestos abatement work will be done in the building to remove hazardous materials from areas that will be affected by construction. The work will be conducted by qualified professionals according to Federal, State and local regulations.

During construction, the contractor will need to use the bus loop as a staging area. For the duration of construction, the pull out area on Norwood in front of the school will be the designated bus drop off area. We realize this will cause some temporary inconvenience and ask that parents be patient and respect this area as a "bus only" drop off zone. Parent drop off and special education bus drop off will remain in the north parking lot. At the end of the project, we will be able to return to using the northeast bus loop and the pull out area on Norwood will once again become a parent drop off area.

The entire project, including the new gym, locker rooms and art room is scheduled to be complete by the middle of the school year. We hope you share our excitement for the great things that are in store for Centennial Middle School!

Cows, Buffaloes, and Rabbits... Oh My!

As many of you are aware, the 7th and 8th grade Advanced Language Arts students became entrepreneurs this fall. We created and sold products, all the while earning profit. However, before we could sell our products, we had to write up extensive business plans, develop elevator pitches, and secure start-up loans to actually buy the materials for making our products. While studying whether or not capitalism is the best route to human happiness, the classes also had to decide what to do if someone was unable to pay back their loans.

Each class had its own Socratic seminar to address this issue. From that discussion, students agreed upon a 7%-10% tax on revenues to be used for a bailout fund to help any business who didn't earn a profit. However, once we had sold our products, everyone had enough money to pay back their loans. Most students had also earned quite a bit of profit as well. So what to do with the \$1,060 bailout fund?

After much discussion, the class decided that the right thing to do was to make a charitable donation. Each class voted and the overall winner was Heifer international. The ALA classes are delighted to be able to donate one heifer, two water buffaloes, and a trio of rabbits to families in need across the world.

Is Your Child Ready to Participate in School Sports?

The advantage of getting the physical over the summer is that you will save a lot of time as sports physicals are only good for one year from the date of examination. Other advantages are you will not need to pull your child out of school during the school day, and your child will be able to begin the season on time because they will not be allowed to participate in any Interscholastic sport without a current physical.

Did you know? The City of Boulder is the number one flash flood risk in the state of Colorado and floods can literally occur **in a flash** during a severe storm. Although Boulder's peak flood season is April 1 through Sept. 30, floods can happen anytime throughout the year. If you live, work or play in Boulder, you are at risk. Be prepared for flooding at any time.

What Can You Do in Case of a Flood?

Be Prepared

- Find out if your home or place of work is in a floodplain.
- Develop an emergency plan.
- Keep an emergency kit accessible.
- Complete a family [Flood Action Plan](#) so you know where your family will meet in an emergency.

During a Flood

- Move to higher ground immediately.
- Stay out of floodwaters. Swift moving waters may sweep people away, causing death.
- Avoid driving through flooded areas. Cars float in 18 inches of water and half of all flood fatalities are auto-related.
- Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. Electrocution is the number two killer in floods.

After a Flood

- Do not return to disaster areas until authorized.
- Clean everything that got wet.
