Dear Broomfield Parents:

We have had an exceptional opening of school. Our staff and students are focused on the learning process in all classes. It is exciting for me to visit classes and directly observe the work going on. You would be impressed and proud of your students.

This year, we changed our daily schedule to incorporate Collaboration Time each Wednesday morning. In developing this new schedule, I assumed the transitions would be smooth for all of us. What I failed to anticipate was the fact that we are all so programmed to a certain way we work at BRHS. Changing our start time on Wednesdays has not been too much of a challenge. What has been a challenge is changing our "even" block days to Wednesday and our "odd" block days to Thursday. Each week, we are still asking each other "What classes meet today?" I thank you for your flexibility with our new schedule and hope we are now in a routine that works for all of us.

The Collaboration Time is being used well by our staff. This time is dedicated to professional development for teachers in departments. Each department has developed department norms for working together. They are currently reviewing data from last year (CSAP, ACT, D/F reports, etc.) to determine their individual department goals for this year. In addition, this time is allowing teachers to work together in developing common assessments and the grading of these assessments. I am impressed with the work my staff has completed so far this year and I continue to expect great things from their work. I want to thank you for your support with this change in schedule.

We are always looking for ways to improve our communication to parents. Our website ([www.bvsvd.org/schools/broomfieldhigh](http://www.bvsvd.org/schools/broomfieldhigh)) is being updated. I encourage you to take time to review this website and give us feedback as to what additional information you would find helpful on our site. We are also sending out emails to parents (sometimes numerous ones per day) with the intent of keeping you informed of all that is taking place at school. Your feedback again is greatly needed. If a mistake is made or the email is unclear, please let us know so we can make the corrections. If we are sending too many in a short amount of time, let me know. Our intent is to give you pertinent information and sometimes we can get carried away. But, I don't want you to begin ignoring our emails due to the quantity. Keep me informed as we work through this new process.

Parent/Teacher Conferences are right around the corner. Mark your calendars for Monday, September 26 and Tuesday, September 27. Monday will be arena style and Tuesday will be in the classrooms. More information will be coming soon.

## **CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY . . . . .**

Cell phones and other electronic devices may not be used in the classroom or during instructional time without permission of the teacher or staff in charge. Teachers or staff will take the cell phone or device away if the student uses them without permission. Cell phones may be held by the instructor or placed in the Main Office in a secure place. Students may pick them up after 3 p.m. regardless of when their school day is over. The second time a cell phone or other device is removed, a parent or guardian must pick it up. The third time this happens, it is an act of defiance and will be treated as such.

When it was time to say goodbye on Aug 26, many tears were shed.

It was a very positive experience for both BHS and French students. The French students attended our classes for three days. BHS students were pleasantly surprised at their ability to understand and communicate with the French students. It made what we do in class more tangible. As a French instructor, it was wonderful to see international friendships flourish and enthusiasm fostered in many students. This experience could not have been possible without the generosity and help of the host families, and to all of you a heartfelt "Thank you". We extend a special thanks to Gina Malecha and her family for hosting an American barbecue to welcome the students. We hope to pay a return visit to France this summer, and hope that this can mark the beginning of an international exchange program between BHS and St Louis in Lorient, Brittany.

## **FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, IS THE STATE OF COLORADO'S OFFICIAL PUPIL COUNT DAY . . . . .**

The amount of money our school gets from the State of Colorado is based on how many students we have in our official "Pupil Count." If your student(s) will be absent on the statewide Count Day (9/30/2011), please ensure they attend school at least one day during **each** of the following windows: 9/23 or 9/26-9/29 **plus** 10/3-10/7. This will ensure our school receives annual funding for them.

## **SCHOOLMESSENGER AND CONTACT MANAGER . . . . .**

In January 2010, BVSD began using SchoolMessenger to send various communications from the district and schools to parents and staff. This includes attendance calls, meal account balance notices, emails **from the superintendent, and emergency notifications.**

**\*A test "emergency" phone call and email will be sent out via SchoolMessenger to all BVSD Parents on Thursday, Sept. 29.\***

Your contact information as it appears in Infinite Campus is uploaded into the SchoolMessenger system every night, so it is very important that your information is correct in Infinite Campus. If it is not correct, please email [ic.brh@bvsd.org](mailto:ic.brh@bvsd.org) to have your information updated.

A nice feature of the SchoolMessenger system is that parents and staff can set their own preferences for which telephone numbers or email addresses are used depending on what sort of communication is being sent. You can also enter a cell phone number in order to receive text messages. This feature is called "Contact Manager." BVSD Communications will email details to you about Contact Manager in early September OR you can learn more about it now in the parent section of the BVSD website at <http://www.bvsd.org/parents/Pages/default.aspx>.

## **SCHOOLMESSENGER Y CONTACT MANAGER . . . . .**

En enero de 2010, BVSD comenzó a usar SchoolMessenger para enviar varias comunicaciones del distrito y de las escuelas a los padres y al personal del distrito. Su información de contacto tal como aparece en Infinite Campus es actualizada todas las noches en el sistema de SchoolMessenger, así que es muy importante que la información esté correcta en Infinite Campus. Si no está correcta, mande un correo electrónico a [ic.brh@bvsd.org](mailto:ic.brh@bvsd.org) para actualizar su información.

Una de las características del sistema SchoolMessenger es que los padres y el personal del distrito pueden indicar su preferencia de qué números de teléfono o direcciones de e-mail usar, dependiendo del tipo de notificación que se envíe. 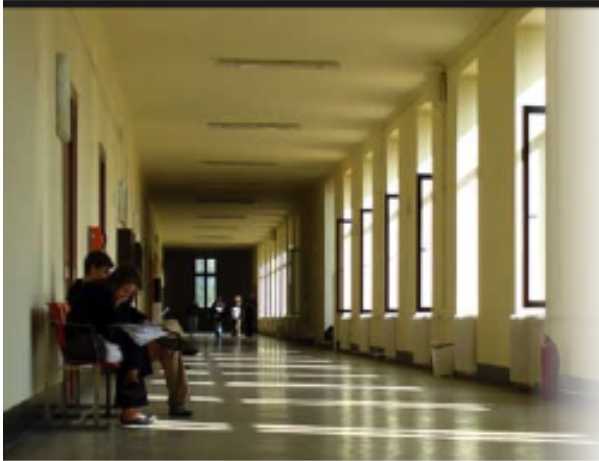
# School Safety Presentation

## Speaking Common Language During a School Crisis

A critical ingredient in the safe school recipe is the classroom response to an incident at school. Weather events, fires, accidents, intruders and other threats to student safety are scenarios that are planned and trained for by school and district administration. Student safety also transcends the classroom and extends socially as well.

John-Michael Keyes, Executive Director of The "I Love U Guys" Foundation, will talk about the Standard Response Protocol (SRP). This presentation is ideal for students and families, school administrators and faculty, emergency managers, fire personnel, emergency medical services, law enforcement and public health officials.

A unique tool, the Standard Response Protocol (SRP), was developed by the Foundation in collaboration with various law and safety agencies, school administrators, students and teachers. The SRP is simple and direct when there is no time to waste.

We hope you'll join us for this dynamic presentation!

### About The "I Love U Guys" Foundation:

The "I Love U Guys" Foundation was created after the shooting at Platte Canyon High School in Bailey, Colorado, in which student Emily Keyes lost her life at the hands of a gunman. Emily's parents are involved in The Foundation which was named after the last text message Emily sent to them while being held hostage. It is rapidly accomplishing the goal of creating a national awareness and adoption of a universal language and action program for use in schools and throughout communities.

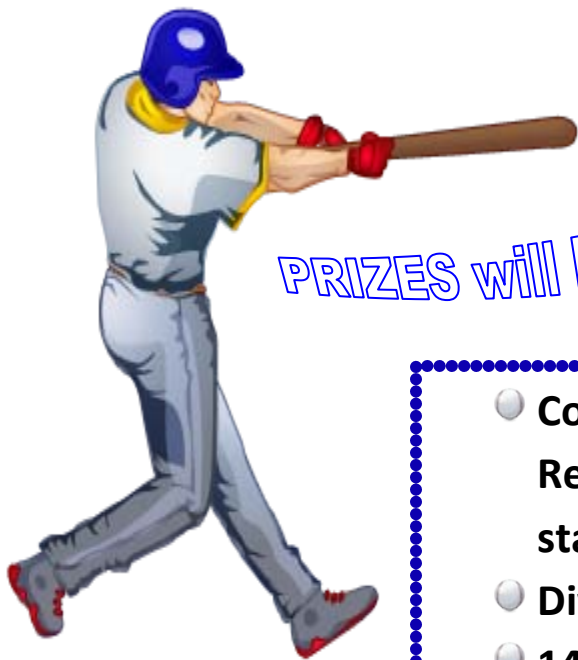

### **SCHOOL CLOSURE INFORMATION**

Fall is here and the changing seasons remind us that inclement weather can result in school being closed for one or more days. We all need to plan ahead and be ready in case that happens.

School district officials have a responsibility to keep the schools in session except under the most extreme conditions. **In the case of extreme inclement weather, parents are requested to make the decision regarding attendance or late arrival of their children. A personal contact by the parent or a written note to school building officials will excuse a student's late arrival or absence during these conditions.**

Occasionally, the weather is severe enough that it is necessary to close schools in all or part of the district. When this occurs, it is extremely important that working parents have pre-arranged child care available to them; arrangements with a friend or neighbor; provisions at a child care center; child care leave from work (if available); arrangements with a neighborhood teenager who also would be out of school; etc. It is very important that parents make these arrangements now, since the weather is unpredictable and often we are hit with storms early in the school year. **The school district web site will continue to be the official public notification of school closures [www.bvsd.org](http://www.bvsd.org).**

### **INFORMACIÓN SOBRE EL CIERRE DE ESCUELAS**
