## From the Principal's Desk:

Dear Broomfield Parents:

In the past month, we have finalized transcripts for first semester, including mailing midyear reports to colleges, successfully begun second semester for our students, and now we are beginning the registration process for 2010-2011. While August may seem like a long time from now, the information you and your students give us now impacts decisions we need to make for the next year's master schedule and staffing. Here are important dates for you to have to support our students:

Feb. 11 – students were given hard copies of our Academic Planning Guide along with directions to enter course requests in Infinite Campus.

Feb. 16 – March 12 – students and parents can and should communicate with teachers and/or counselors to get more information and recommendations for courses.

Feb. 16 – March 12 – the registration window in Infinite Campus will be open for students to input their requests.

March 15 – 19 – counselors and administrators will be tracking down the “stragglers” to register. Hopefully that number will be very small.

March 31 – April 9 – Teachers and counselors will be reviewing student requests for accuracy of placement into courses.

Month of April – Students will be notified if a course request will not be offered for next year. Different options will be offered to students.

Thanks in advance for helping your student get this information into the computer in a timely manner.

In addition to working on the registration process, staff will be focusing our efforts on our role in the 2010-2011 budget process for BVSD. The superintendent and district staff members are holding community forums throughout our district. I would encourage you to attend these meetings to learn more about the challenges we are facing.

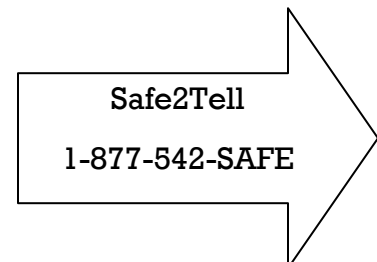

## Exciting News for Juniors! ACT Preparation Course Available Again

We are excited to announce that Broomfield High School has contracted with RMASS Education Seminars to train our teachers to provide ACT preparation for our

juniors. ACT preparation will be offered during the school day at a dramatically reduced cost in preparation for the mandatory ACT test in April.

The five hour class is generally \$89, but in an effort to bring this program to more students, we will be offering the course for \$30. We had overwhelming participation in this program last year and have seen a dramatic rise in both individual and school wide ACT scores.

The course will be offered Tuesday, March 9 and Wednesday, March 10 from 8:30 – 11:00 AM. (Juniors will not have class these two mornings due to CSAP testing for freshmen and sophomores.)

Registration for the course will start Monday, February 1, 2010 and run through February 26, 2010 in the Counseling Office. Please encourage your student to register for this important opportunity. (Please contact a counselor if you are unable to pay the \$30 fee for this course.)

## BHS ATTENDANCE POLICY REMINDERS:

Excusing absences:

- **Calls by parents or guardian must occur with 48 hours following the absence.** Parents can also access the Attendance Office message machine after hours at 720-561-5381.
- Bring appropriate written documentation for any missed class time for doctor’s or dentist’s appointments.

- **Single period absences during the day MUST be documented.**
- If during the day, your student needs to miss a class, please be sure to write a note excusing your student. ### CSAP Information

From March 2 thru March 10, 2010, our 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will participate in the reading, writing and math CSAP tests. These tests include questions that require written answers, as well as multiple-choice items. Six state literacy standards are measured on the reading and writing CSAP tests, including reading comprehension, writing for a variety of purposes and audiences, and writing using correct grammar and spelling. The State math standards are assessed with a separate test. The math assessment requires students to solve mathematical problems, to do computation, and to communicate their answers effectively. State science standards will be assessed for all 10<sup>th</sup> grade students during this testing period as well.

Each test (reading, writing and math) has three sessions, for a total of nine sessions. Each session lasts approximately one hour. The three tests (nine sessions) will be administered over the course of four days.

Students in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade will have three additional science sessions.

Last year, Broomfield High School had 100% participation in the CSAP testing program. We were the only school in the district to achieve this goal. The information gained by having all students participate in the testing has allowed us to reassess program delivery and to make more informed recommendations into student placement into classes.

You will receive a report describing your child's achievement for each of these three CSAP tests in late August. The report will include your child's performance compared to the State's reading, writing and math standards. Teachers also receive this information and use it as one indicator of student performance and progress over time.

After doing more studies, he has now currently been at Channel 7 News for 10 years. Our final speaker, Daniel Burke is a family physician as well as program director for The University of Colorado Denver School of Medicine; the University Hospital in Denver was voted third best in the country in 2009. ### **New CSAP Student Growth Reports Now Available**

This year the Colorado Department of Education created a new report that charts individual student growth in reading, writing and mathematics on Colorado Student Assessment Program (CSAP) tests. To save paper and printing costs, the Boulder Valley School District is distributing these new reports electronically for middle and high students via the Parent Portal of Infinite Campus. To access these reports, either:

(1) Click the "CSAP Growth Reports" link that is below the Infinite Campus portal buttons on the front page of the district website at [bvsd.org](http://bvsd.org), or

(2) Log in to the parent portal as you would normally. (If you don't know how to do this and wish to learn or do not have a password, please contact the school.) At the top of the parent portal page, click on the "BVSD Parent Portal Tools" link under District Notices.

Either approach takes you to a screen where you will need to log in; this is to safeguard the privacy of your student's report. After logging in, follow links to click on the name of any student of yours who took the CSAP last spring and has a growth report.

### **Ya están disponibles los nuevos Informes de Crecimiento de los Estudiantes en CSAP**

Este año el Departamento de Educación de Colorado ha creado un nuevo informe que traza el crecimiento individual de los estudiantes en lectura, escritura y matemáticas en las pruebas del Programa de Evaluaciones de Estudiantes de Colorado (CSAP). Para ahorrar dinero y costos de impresión, el Distrito Escolar del Valle de Boulder ha decidido distribuir estos nuevos informes por vía electrónica a los estudiantes en escuelas intermedias y preparatorias.

Los Informes de Rendimiento y Crecimiento de 2009 de los estudiantes están disponibles en el Portal de Padres de Infinite

Campus. Para acceder a estos informes haga lo siguiente:

(1) Haga clic en el enlace “CSAP Growth Report” que está debajo de los botones del portal de Infinite Campus en la página principal del sitio web del distrito en [www.bvsvd.org](http://www.bvsvd.org).

### **BVSD Parent Snapshot Surveys coming in February and March**

BVSD surveys students, parents and staff each year in order to gather information that can be used to guide efforts to improve schools. The survey of parents is called the “Parent Snapshot Survey” and parents will be

receiving it in the next few weeks. We hope all parents and guardians will take a moment to complete and return this survey. The more parents who participate, the more accurately the survey data will reflect parents’ perceptions and opinions. The survey results are reviewed by school staff to determine what programs and processes are working and which ones need improvement. Consequently, the survey results can have a significant impact on school operations.

For the first time this year, the Parent Snapshot Survey will be administered online for all parents who have provided an email address to their student’s school and who receive all communication in English. This supports a greener and more cost effective process by reducing the amount of paper used, mailing cost, and data entry required. We also hope this will increase the parent participation rate. Online surveys will be sent by email in February.

If there is not an email address associated to your household or if your primary language is Spanish, you will receive a survey via U.S. postal service consistent with last year. Paper surveys will be mailed at the beginning of March.

Because the same survey has been given for several years, school staff and School Accountability Committees are able to study trends and patterns in responses. All of this information helps schools serve you in the best way possible.

### **En febrero y marzo llegarán las Encuestas Instantáneas de BVSD para los Padres**

BVSD encuesta a los estudiantes, a los padres y a los maestros todos los años para poder reunir información que se pueda utilizar como guía para mejorar las escuelas. La encuesta de los padres es conocida como “Encuesta Instantánea para Padres” y pueden esperar recibirla en las próximas semanas.
