From the Principal's Desk:

Dear Broomfield Parents:

We are well into second semester and students and staff are engaged in the learning process. We continue to look for new and different ways to engage students and encourage them to do their best in all facets of school life. You are an integral part of this process and I would like to share with you some of the strategies we are currently implementing this semester. Some of the strategies have been modified for this semester to better meet the needs of our students.

1. Eagle Learning Center – This program began as an after-school support time for students needing extra help. It expanded last semester to meet during the day, but our location did not attract students. This semester we have moved ELC to the library and support is available for students Periods 3-7 and after school. Students can access staff members for help with homework or projects, help with studying for tests, or for supervision of missed tests due to absences. I encourage all students to take advantage of this support.
2. Math CSAP Support – The Math Department is offering a Math CSAP Prep class for identified students during the 7:30 to 8:00 am time slot on Thursday mornings. Parents were notified of the invitation and I appreciate your support in encouraging your students to attend. I believe this academic support will show positive growth in our math grades as well as on CSAP.
3. Our RtI team reviewed first semester grades of our freshman students and “invited” a group of students to attend a Study Skills class on Thursday mornings. Research shows that students with failing grades as freshmen have difficulty throughout high school and beyond. We want to change that behavior. I met with this group of students last Thursday and expect great things from them. In addition to staff members supporting these students, we also have upper-class “Blue Crew” mentors to help students.
4. Tutor Time is an excellent way to have students get additional support. With the numerous activities our students are involved in, I encourage them to use Tutor Time wisely and not always relax and just chat with their friends.
5. This year, our teachers have been implementing new Standards Based Grading policies as well as beginning the implementation of BVSD’s new Guaranteed Viable Curriculum. Both of these efforts have given teachers the support and need to work collaboratively on assignments, assessments, and re-teaching/re-testing opportunities. I thank my staff for all their hard work on these efforts for our students.

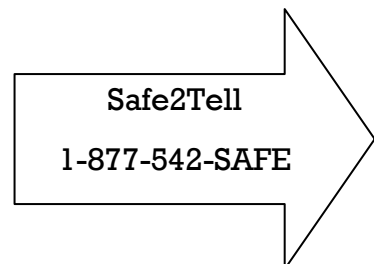

2010 – 2011 COURSE SELECTION BEGINS SOON

The Broomfield High School pre-registration process for the 2010-2011 school year will begin on February 11 with class meetings to distribute Academic Planning Guides and worksheets for on-line course selection. All students will be encouraged to meet with current and former teachers for recommendations, to take these materials home to discuss best options with their parents, and additionally, parents may solicit advice from teachers concerning academic choices during the February 11 Parent Teacher Conferences.

BHS counselors will visit Aspen Creek, BHMS and Nativity on February 25 and 26 to share information and to answer questions concerning the course registration process.

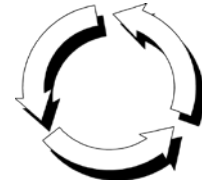
An Academic Planning Night will be held for all incoming ninth grade students and their parents on Tuesday, March 2, 2010, beginning at 7 p.m. in the BHS auditorium. Prior to the academic portion of the program, students and parents may meet with coaches of the athletic programs offered at BHS beginning at 6 p.m. in Wilkerson Gym.

All students will need to complete their on-line pre-registration for courses by Friday, March 12, 2010.

DROPPING and ADDING CLASSES

The BVSD School Board withdrawal policy allows students to drop a class during the first 15 days of a semester with no grade reported on the student's transcript. Students have until January 27, 2010 for a "clean" drop. Following this date, students have the option of a WP (withdraw passing) or WF (withdraw failing) until February 18, 2010. Dropping a class during the WP / WF period requires signatures from parent, counselor, teacher and administrator. For further information, please see a counselor.

ACT Preparation Course
Available Again**

We are excited to announce that Broomfield High School has contracted with RMASS Education Seminars to train our teachers to provide ACT preparation for our juniors. ACT preparation will be offered during the school day at a dramatically reduced cost in preparation for the mandatory ACT test in April.

The five hour class is generally \$89, but in an effort to bring this program to more students, we will be offering the course for \$30. We had overwhelming participation in this program last year and have seen a dramatic rise in both individual and school wide ACT scores.

The course will be offered Tuesday, March 9 and Wednesday, March 10 from 8:30 – 11:00 AM. (Juniors will not have class these two mornings due to CSAP testing for freshmen and sophomores.)

Registration for the course will start Monday, February 1, 2010 and run through February 26, 2010 in the Counseling Office. Please encourage your student to register for this important opportunity. (Please contact a counselor if you are unable to pay the \$30 fee for this course.)

College Deadlines Approaching

College application and scholarship deadlines are quickly approaching. Please take note of the following:

Colorado State University – freshmen who are admitted and meet all eligibility criteria by March 1, 2010 automatically will be considered for admission-based merit scholarships. (Online at <http://ramweb.colostate.edu>)

Colorado College – Applicants must submit a complete admission application in addition to the Profile application and FAFSA application. These forms should be submitted as early as possible.

Fort Lewis College – Priority filing for FAFSA is February 15, 2010.

Front Range Community College – FAFSA and scholarship deadline March 1, 2010.

Metro State – FAFSA deadline March 1, 2010.

CU – Boulder – Submit FAFSA as soon as possible. Scholarship information can be obtained at www.colorado.edu/finaid/scholarships/html.

CU- Colorado Springs – FAFSA deadline March 1, 2010 for maximum consideration.

CU-Denver – Freshmen are automatically considered for academic achievement scholarships if accepted for admission by February 1, 2010. FAFSA should be submitted as soon as possible.

University of Northern Colorado – Priority consideration March 1, 2010 for FAFSA.

If you have additional questions, contact the financial aid office at the specific college or university to which you are applying.



Grief and Loss Support Group

Our school interventionist, Traci Hagie, and school social worker, Lauren Kaven, will again co-facilitate a Grief and Loss Support Group second semester. The group will begin on February 9, 2010 and run for seven weeks on alternating class periods, utilizing guidelines from HospiceCare of Boulder and Broomfield Counties. The goal for students attending this group is to feel supported as they grieve the loss of a close family member or friend.

Traci also provides services to students struggling with tobacco and substance use issues, and Lauren is available to provide services and crisis intervention for students struggling with social/emotional/behavioral issues.

Q & A about FAFSA and Financial Aid

Now is the time for filing for financial aid. Students and parents will need to complete the FAFSA form on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov to apply for most grants, college work-study and loans. Some colleges will

also require additional applications. In order to complete the FAFSA, most students and their parents will need to complete or estimate their taxes for 2009. Here are a few commonly asked questions about financial aid:

What types of financial aid are available?

Grants, scholarships, college work-study and student loans are available. Most comes from the federal government, the rest from the state (where the student usually must be a resident), the school or private sources. For federal aid, students and parents must complete the FAFSA.

What are the particulars?

Grants and scholarships do NOT have to be repaid. Federal grants include the Pell Grant and the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG). The Pell Grant goes to eligible students. Schools offer the SEOG to students with exceptional need.

College work-study dollars are awarded based on financial need as part of the financial aid package. Students find a campus-based job and receive a paycheck up to the amount of the work-study financial award.

Student loans are borrowed like car or house loans and students MUST REPAY them. Typical loans are the PLUS Loan (a parent loan) or the STAFFORD Loan (a student loan).

Scholarships require separate applications. A good time to begin a scholarship search is during your junior year in high school, or the year before the student plans to attend school.

What happens after a student files the FAFSA?

You'll receive financial aid from your school's financial aid office. Results from the FAFSA provide the student and family with the Estimated Family Contribution (EFC), or the amount the family is expected to pay. The FAFSA determines how much you and your family can afford based on income, assets, and the number of people in your family. The school deducts the Cost of Attendance (COA) to determine your financial need. The EFC will remain the same no matter what school the student attends. The COA differs from school to school.

What does it mean when a college/university says that they "meet need"?

This means that the total cost of the education is covered by loans, grants, scholarships and family contribution. Some schools are able to meet need or others are not. This will vary from family to family and school to school.

Please do not wait to file the FAFSA. Several colleges have reported that they depleted their funds prior to their recommended deadline last year.

During this last month I reviewed the immunization status of all our students, a big job to say the least. Some of our families received notes in the mail stating which immunization was missing.

If you received a note and have questions, please feel free to call or email me. The biggest confusion right now is that parents have turned in immunization reports and are wondering why I don't have them. Many reasons exist, but the truth is somehow we do not have a record of that particular immunization. You can have your doctor's office fax them to me or you can send them yourself.

The second big question is regarding the Tdap. Yes, most children have had five DPaT's when they were under the age of seven and possibly a Td when they were older. In the last couple of years the Colorado Department of Public Health has made the immunization Tdap, the adolescent version of the DPaT(hence the different letter makeup), a mandatory shot for all students in 10th through 12th grade. Some of our students may have had the shot and I just do not have the record of it. But if you are unsure, call me or bring me the record and I will help decipher the information. Thank you in advance to all families for getting me the information as quickly as possible.

If your child has a new health problem or any new illness, please be sure to notify the clinic so that we can assist you in the continued care of your child.

Many students come to my office looking for medication for headaches or colds. BVSD school policy states that medicine can not be given out without a doctor's note. If your student gets frequent headaches or needs to use other meds on a frequent basis you can get a medication form in my office that your family doctor can fill out and

then we may release the medication to your student.

Just a reminder that February 9, 2010 is our Vision and Hearing screening. All 9th graders and any students new to the district will be screened. All 9th graders had their vision tested at registration in August, so they will only be getting their hearing screens done. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

A Statewide Fiscal Crisis is Hitting all 178 School Districts throughout Colorado

Large budget cuts must be made by every school and department in Boulder Valley School District

According to state elected leaders and the media, Colorado state government is now in the second year of its worst fiscal crisis since the Great Depression. Until now, BVSD has generally been able to shield the schools from budget cuts, but the news from the Capitol has gotten worse in the last few weeks. The reductions in state funding for BVSD are now much too large to be managed without significant cuts to school budgets.

BVSD Superintendent Chris King and district budget and finance

staff began meeting with all 54 BVSD principals, assistant principals, and department directors in January to talk about how to manage this budget crisis. Because BVSD cannot be certain that the cuts for 2010-2011 will not go even deeper, this group was presented preliminary plans for 1) a best case scenario (\$12 million in BVSD cuts), 2) a middle case scenario (\$18 million in BVSD cuts) or 3) a worst case scenario (\$25 million in BVSD cuts). For schools, the amounts needed to be cut to meet each of these three targets are 2.25 percent, 5.25 percent, or 8.25 percent. Each department in BVSD's central administration will make cuts of 7.5 percent, 13.50 percent or 19.75 percent, depending on how large the final funding cuts end up being from the state.

Difficult decisions will need to be made during the next couple of months. Parents are encouraged to provide input to their School Accountability Committee (formerly called the "SIT" or "School Improvement Team") about proposed cuts at their school. Each school's accountability committee will report back to the District Accountability Committee in April on the input they received from parents. In addition, the superintendent will be scheduling more superintendent/community budget meetings than ever before. The meeting schedule will be sent to all BVSD parents as soon as it is finalized. It will include daytime and evening meetings.

"These budget decisions will be reached through a process of collaboration," Superintendent

Chris King reported to the Boulder Valley Board of Education during its Jan. 12 meeting. "This will not necessarily be a process of consensus, but it will very much be a process of input collection and analysis."

Cuts this deep cannot help but affect almost everyone in the district, including students, but we are committed to maintaining the excellent and equitable educational experience that BVSD is known for, no matter what.

Una crisis fiscal a nivel estatal está afectando a todos los 178 distritos escolares de Colorado

Cada escuela y departamento en el Distrito Escolar del Valle de Boulder deberá hacer grandes recortes a su presupuesto

Según los dirigentes elegidos del estado y los medios de comunicación, el gobierno del estado de Colorado está ahora en el segundo año de su peor crisis fiscal desde la Gran Depresión. Hasta ahora, BVSD casi siempre ha podido proteger a las escuelas de recortes presupuestarios, pero las noticias del Capitolio han empeorado en las últimas semanas. Las reducciones en los fondos estatales para BVSD son ahora demasiado grandes para ser manejados sin recortes significativos a los presupuestos de las escuelas.

El Superintendente de BVSD Chris King y el personal de presupuesto y finanzas comenzaron a reunirse con todos

los 54 directores escolares en BVSD, subdirectores y directores de departamento en enero para hablar acerca de cómo manejar esta crisis presupuestaria. Ya que BVSD no puede estar seguro qué tan hondos serán los recortes para 2010-2011, este grupo presentó planes preliminares para 1) en el mejor de los casos (\$12 millones en recortes para BVSD), 2) en un escenario medio (\$18 millones en recortes para BVSD) ó 3) en el peor de los casos (\$25 millones en recortes para BVSD). Para las escuelas, los recortes necesarios para cumplir cada uno de estos tres objetivos son el 2.25 por ciento, 5.25 por ciento ó 8.25 por ciento. Cada departamento en la administración central de BVSD hará recortes del 7.5 por ciento, 13.50 por ciento ó 19.75 por ciento, dependiendo de cuán grande es el recorte final de fondos del Estado.

Se deberán tomar decisiones difíciles durante el próximo par de meses. Se anima a los padres a contribuir con sugerencias a los Comités de Responsabilidad Escolar (anteriormente llamado "SIT" o "Equipo de Mejoramiento Escolar") acerca de los recortes presupuestarios en su escuela. Cada comité de responsabilidad escolar informará a la Comisión de Responsabilidades del Distrito en abril sobre las sugerencias que recibieron de los padres. Adicionalmente, el Superintendente programará aún más reuniones con la comunidad sobre el presupuesto. El calendario de reuniones se enviará a todos los padres de BVSD tan pronto como esté finalizado. Habrá reuniones durante el día y la tarde-noche.

"Estas decisiones de presupuesto se lograrán a través de un proceso de colaboración", dijo el Superintendente Chris King al Consejo de Educación del Valle de Boulder en su reunión del 12 de enero. "Esto no será necesariamente un proceso de consenso, pero sí será un proceso de recolección de opiniones y análisis".

Recortes tan profundos no pueden dejar de afectar a casi todos en el distrito, incluyendo a los estudiantes, pero estamos comprometidos a toda costa a mantener la excelente y equitativa experiencia educativa por la que BVSD es conocido.
