B- SAFE (Broomfield's Substance and Alcohol Free Environment) for teens is a program designed to provide substance abuse and prevention services to teenagers living in Broomfield County or who attend a school in Broomfield County. Substance Abuse Coordinators are available over the summer months to meet with teenagers individually or in a group setting, talk with parents about treatment options, conduct substance abuse evaluations, and provide referrals to area resources. All services provided by the B-SAFE program are located at the City and County of Broomfield Health and Human Services office at 6 Garden Center and are free of charge. COUNSELORS' COURNER

For Juniors - Over the Summer

This is an excellent time to research colleges and universities. Plan to visit as many campuses as possible to tour the school and to obtain additional information. Most college admissions offices offer tours; contact the individual colleges to find out more. If you are visiting a "selective" college, make sure they know that you were there by completing a visitation card.

Complete your resume on Naviance(connection.naviance.com/broomfieldhs) and begin your personal essay for college applications. Decide who you are going to ask for letters of recommendation. Teachers tend to write better letters when there are fewer time constraints. All

applications that are completed using the "Common Application" require a counselor letter of recommendation. Please complete the counselor letter of recommendation questionnaire on Naviance. Be prepared to discuss your plans during your senior review in either September or October.

If you want to be eligible to be recruited by colleges to play Division I or Division II athletics, you must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center as soon as possible. For more information and to register visit: http://eligibilitycenter.org/ECWR2/NCAA_EMS/NCAA.html

Top Six Mistakes in Choosing a College

According to Marty Nemko, Ph. D. and author of "The All-in-One College Guide" parents and students typically make several mistakes when searching for the best college. The top six are listed:

1. Relying on a college's advertising. Beware of anything that looks too good to be true.
2. Being too shy to ask questions. This is one of the most expensive purchases that you will ever make. You will also be spending a minimum of four years with your decision. You have earned the right to ask the tough questions.
3. Relying on one person's opinion. For example, your next door neighbor or girlfriend.
4. Assuming more costly colleges are better. Public colleges are typically subsidized by your tax dollars so the price is lower. That has nothing to do with quality.
5. Relying on a college's reputation. The most difficult college to get into may not be the best fit for you.
6. Relying on the rankings in major news magazines. Most of the rankings are based primarily on data that each college's administration itself submits.

2011 Yearbook Senior Photo FAQs

Senior photos are due Friday, November 5, 2010. Photo studios often take four to six weeks to process photos, so please plan accordingly when making an appointment in order to meet our deadline. We encourage you to have photos taken during the summer to avoid any problems. However, please note that an expensive studio photo is not necessary and we will be happy to include a nice head shot that you arrange to have done with the same specifications listed below:

- Head and shoulders only

- 1 and 1/4 inch from chin to top of forehead
- color
- glossy
- photo size two inches by three inches
- no props
- soft focus NOT acceptable
- digital photos acceptable (please put
- the photo on a CD)
- lightly print name on back of photo with a ballpoint pen, NOT a felt pen (it smears!)
- place photo in an envelope or attach to a piece of paper and place in the "senior photos" box in the Main Office.

Return of photos: We CANNOT return senior photos.

Names: We CANNOT use nicknames in the senior section.

Vo-tech students: If you will be attending Vo-Tech during your senior year, please be sure to read all parent newsletters for yearbook announcements, stop by the Main Office, or call the school for information.

NEW VACCINE REQUIREMENTS (2010-2011)

Tdap REQUIRED FOR 6TH- 12TH

Pertussis (whooping cough) can be a very serious disease in infants and small children. Colorado ranks fifth of all states in the country with this disease. It has been found that siblings who have Pertussis disease can frequently expose other children in the household. Per Colorado state law, Tdap vaccine will be required for all students in grades 6-12 for the upcoming school year (10-11). It is the responsibility of the parents to provide an updated record of immunization to the school. If you

do not wish your child to have this vaccine for personal or religious reasons, please sign a waiver that is available in the Health Room.

A medical exemption must be signed by a physician.

La Tos Ferina puede ser una enfermedad muy seria entre los bebés y los niños de corta edad. Se ha observado que con frecuencia los niños que tienen tos ferina pueden contagiar a sus hermanos. Colorado es el quinto estado que más casos tiene de esta enfermedad en el país. Por lo que se ha pasado una ley que exige que todos los estudiantes de 6° a 12° grado se pongan la vacuna Tdap para el próximo año escolar 2010-11. Los padres son responsables de dar a la escuela el informe de vacunas de sus hijos. Si no quieren que su hijo se ponga la vacuna por motivos personales o religiosos, por favor firmen un documento de exención que pueden obtener en la Enfermería.

La exención por motivos médicos debe ser firmada por un doctor.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION: It is **extremely important** that the **Emergency Information** card be returned to school on the first day. If there is ever an emergency this is the information we use to contact you and also provide to emergency personnel for treatment. **Please complete the entire form and be sure to sign the back.** Include information on any medications prescribed for your child, whether or not they are given during the school day. Also describe any health conditions which may affect your child's school routine or performance. **Please do not leave anything blank.** Please indicate if something is not applicable. It is important that two emergency contacts are listed and let them be aware they are on the list. Be sure to notify the office with any changes in emergency information and phone numbers: both home and work. If your child is ill, he or she may only be released to those listed on the Emergency Information card. If you will be out of town, please inform office staff in writing to report whom will be caring for your child in your absence.

MEDICATION INFORMATION: Medications are not to be in the personal possession of students. For all prescription and non-prescription medications, a student's parent or guardian shall make a written request for school personnel to administer medications by providing the completed Medication Administration Authorization form, which is to be *signed by both parent and physician*. A new Authorization form must be signed and submitted for each new prescription medication or each dosage change. **Authorization forms must be completed each year. These forms are available in the school's health room.** Completed forms can be faxed to the school. Prescription medication supplied by the student's parents or guardian must be in a properly labeled bottle dispensed by a pharmacy. Non-prescription, or "as needed" medications must be in the original labeled container. The bottle should also be labeled with the student's name.

PHYSICALS: It is **recommended** that all students entering 10th grade and all those new to the District receive a physical examination. Most physicians have the examination report forms in their offices. Please return the form on the first day of school or as soon as possible. **A yearly physical is required for students participating in extracurricular school sports.** Tdap vaccine will be required for all 9th through 12th grade students for the upcoming school year (10-11). If you received a letter this year indicating your student was non-compliant on immunizations or needs the Tdap, refer to the information on immunization clinics below.

INFORMACIÓN DE EMERGENCIA: Es de suma importancia que devuelvan a la escuela las **Tarjetas de Emergencia** el primer día de clases. Rellenen todos los datos y firmenla. Incluyan cualquier medicamento que le hayan recetado a su hijo, tanto si lo toma durante horas de clase como si no. También describan cualquier problema de salud que afecte la rutina o el rendimiento escolar del niño. Es importante que nos proporcionen la información de dos personas de contacto en caso de emergencia y notifiquenles de ello. Asegúrense de notificar a la oficina si ocurre algún cambio en esta información durante el año escolar. Si su niño se llegara a enfermar mientras se encuentra en la escuela, sólo se le dejará salir con una de las personas indicadas en la Tarjeta de Emergencia. Si usted va a salir de viaje, necesitamos que nos informe por escrito el nombre de la persona que va a cuidar de su niño durante su ausencia.

MEDICAMENTOS: **El estudiante no puede llevar consigo los medicamentos.** Para administrar medicamentos con o sin receta a un estudiante, su padre o tutor deberá rellenar una Autorización para Administrar Medicamentos. Esta autorización *deberá ser firmada por el padre/tutor y por el médico.* Cada vez que el niño cambie de medicamento, el padre o tutor deberá repetir el proceso. Estos formularios están disponibles en la enfermería de la escuela y pueden ser devueltos por fax. Todos los años se debe renovar la autorización. **Todos los medicamentos que los padres/tutores nos entreguen para su estudiante deberán estar en su envase original con la etiqueta de la farmacia.** Los medicamentos sin receta para administrar "en caso de necesidad", deberán estar en su envase original y mostrar el nombre del niño en un lugar visible.

EXAMEN FÍSICO: Se **recomienda** un examen físico a todos los estudiantes que vayan a empezar kindergarten, 4°, 7° y 10° grado así como a los que sean nuevos en el Distrito. Su doctor tiene un formulario que deberá rellenar después del examen. Entreguen ese formulario en la escuela el primer día de clase o tan pronto como les sea posible. **Es obligatorio que todos los estudiantes que participen en deportes extracurriculares o que se inscriban en programa preescolar se hagan un examen físico todos los años.**

Cheerleading Tryouts: Tryouts will be held May 19, 20, and 25, 2010 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. in the Eagle Gym at Broomfield High School. Cheer tryout packets will be available in the main office on Tuesday afternoon, May 11, 2010.

Pom Tryouts: Tryouts have been completed for the 2010-11 school year.

All registration forms must be completed and on file in the Athletic Office **BEFORE** any athlete is allowed to practice.

This includes a current physical. Physical exams are valid for 365 days from the date of issue. It is recommended that athletes schedule a physical exam for June or July.

Registration fees for athletics are \$185 per sport played in the school year. There is a family maximum of \$405 per school year.

If the athlete does not remain on the team, the registration fee will be refunded **prior to the first official contest.** If the player leaves or is cut from the team, it is the responsibility of the athlete and family to pick up the refund.

In several sports the number of participants is more than the number of levels offered. At times “cuts” must be made at various levels. Tryouts will be conducted at the start of each official sport season to determine placement on teams. Athletes are encouraged to contact the individual coach or the school regarding practice schedules.

ELIGIBILITY

Athletic eligibility guidelines are in accordance with Colorado High School Activity Association rules. All student athletes at Broomfield High School must be taking and attending at least five classes and failing no more than one class. Failure to do so results in the athletes being ineligible for the next week's contests. Additionally, if an athlete is failing the same class two consecutive weeks, he/she is ineligible for the following week's contests.

Various optional "off season" activities may be available in different sports. Athletes are encouraged to contact the individual sport coach for information regarding "off season" opportunities for specific sports. Parents and athletes may contact the coaches at Broomfield High School during regular school hours 720-561-8100.

Semester:

1. Incoming 9th graders are automatically eligible for competition.
2. Students must be enrolled for a minimum of five (5) classes.
3. If a student, other than an incoming 9th grader, receives two (2) or more (F) grades a semester, that student will be ineligible for competition for the next nine (9) weeks grading period. Athletic eligibility will be reinstated if the student is passing all classes after the end of the nine (9) week grading period.

Weekly:

1. If a student receives an (F) grade for two (2) or more classes, he/she will become ineligible for athletic participation until the next weekly reporting date in which the (F) grade is brought up to passing.
2. If a student receives an (F) grade in a single class for a second consecutive week, he/she will be ineligible for competition until the next weekly reporting date in which that (F) grade is brought up to passing.

Code of Conduct

All athletes must sign a code of conduct. This code has year round expectations. It is important to note that actions out of season that are violations of the code are subject to consequences outlined in the code. These consequences progress with repeat violations. Parents and athletes should review the code to ensure they are familiar with the expectations and consequences.
