Dear Parents

The start to the school year is always an exciting time. I look forward to welcoming our kindergartners and new students starting on their educational journey, and to observing how our students have grown over the summer and are ready for the next grade level. It is a new beginning for all of us. I have high expectations for learning and growing together as a school community during the 2011-12 school year. As I think about last year, we were unpacking boxes, moving furniture and cleaning dust from the bond construction. We are in such better condition and prepared for the start of this school year. Remodeling and construction are challenging times. We have certainly reaped the benefits from our bond projects with the patience of our parents and staff members and the generosity of the Boulder County voters.

I hope that you had a chance to visit the Heatherwood library program this summer. Children listened to story time, and they also had the opportunity to check out books. I would like to thank Diane Richey, our kindergarten teacher, and Tabitha Brown, a Heatherwood parent, for leading and facilitating the library program. The summer program creates an easier transition for kindergarten and new students. They are able to become familiar with our school and meet our wonderful teacher Mrs. Richey. I would also like to thank our PTO for funding this worthwhile event.

There are many exciting and some challenging things to look forward to this school year. The Heatherwood technology computer refresh and replacement took place this summer. Your children will be working on new DELL desktop and laptop computers this year. Teachers will be studying the changes in the BVSD revised curriculum to guide their instruction and prepare to meet the common core standards, as well as piloting the Investigations II program which will include a consumable student workbook. Students will be responsible for the expectations of our Positive Behavior Support program (PBS) implemented by all adults and students in the building. The School Accountability Committee (SAC) will set our goals based on patterns of achievement and climate data over time. Parents will be asked to donate to the Heatherwood Impact Month (HIM) and to volunteer their time to support our school programs. These are a small portion of the events that will occur this year. Our PTO and SAC will inform you of the many more activities and meetings that you are invited to attend and participate in to make our school an even better place for our children to learn.

Please welcome the new members of the Heatherwood staff this year. Vanessa Rydquist, will be our new preschool/kindergarten .5 community liaison, working to support communication and early childhood education at our school. Shannon Fey, who taught first grade at Emerald Elementary in Broomfield, will teach .5 in first grade. Alexandria Hayes, who taught intermediate and middle school music at Flagstaff Academy in St. Vrain School District, will teach music and direct the Hot Shots Choir. Ashley Brandin will join us as an Instrumental Music teacher. Sacha Mittelman is our new school psychologist. Lori Januszewski will join us as a .5 special education teacher. Caren McMahan will join the Kindergarten Enrichment program as a paraeducator. Please stop in and say hello to our new teachers and staff members that have heard so much about our wonderful students and school community. Please see the teacher roster enclosed with this newsletter for an update on staff assignments.

The first day of school for first through fifth grade students is Monday, August 15. There is a separate and different start to school for kindergartners. This type of start creates an easier transition for our young children. Kindergarten assessments are scheduled for Monday, August 15 and Tuesday, August 16. Kindergarten students will be assigned a 30 minute interval to attend on either Monday or Tuesday. There will not be Kindergarten Enrichment on these days. Wednesday, August 17 and Thursday, August 18 are staggered start days for kindergartners where half of the class attends on one of the two days. Kindergarten Enrichment will be available starting August 17 and 18, only on the staggered start day that you child attends. If your child attends the staggered start day on Wednesday, then they will be able to attend KE that day only and not on Thursday. If your child attends the staggered start day on Thursday, then they will be able to attend KE that day only and not on Wednesday. All kindergartners attend school on Friday, August 19 and Kindergarten Enrichment will be available for all registered children.

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For your future planning, September 1 is an assessment day for all kindergarten through fifth grade students. Students will attend school and will have one-on-one or group assessment time with their teachers and peers. All students kindergarten through fifth grade will be assessed by Heatherwood teachers and service providers. Teachers are excited about having this time with their students to assess their reading, discuss math problems and to provide time for them to write. It preserves valuable instructional time during the regular school days. Watch future newsletters for more information on the assessment days.

We will have our Open House for children to drop off supplies on Friday, August 12 from 12:30 to 1:30 for families with last names beginning from A-K and 1:30 to 2:30 for families with last names beginning with L-Z. We are trying to eliminate the bottleneck and long lines that occurred during last year's Open House. We will have computers set up for parents. This is an opportunity for parents to fill out their directory information, Impact Pledge, and to meet our PTO representatives and then for students and parents to visit teachers and their classrooms. Students may bring in their school supplies that afternoon which should make it a little less overwhelming on the first day. The doors to the school will be locked until 12:30 PM in order for teachers to prepare their classrooms. Please, no early visitors that day.

I would again remind family members that good habits form at an early age. Parents are encouraged to have their children arrive to school on time. We will again initiate our tardy policy that tracks the number of tardies. Students attend after school tardy detention for twenty minutes after their third tardy of the trimester. There will be a full three-week grace period where tardies will not be counted at the beginning of school.

There are many ways for parents to become involved in their children's education. Parents can volunteer in the classroom or office, participate in school governance, such as SAC and PTO, or work at home. Please look for the BVSD volunteer background screening program information in this Husky Highlights. It is very important that you read this information. We would like to thank the many PTO parents who are working very hard to make the start of the new school year easier for all of our parents. Many thanks go to Wendi Hill and the entire PTO Executive Board for working this summer on the Impact Fundraising Plan. We are very fortunate to have dedicated parents that help to make our school one of the best in the district.

The physical and emotional safety of our students and school community members is our primary goal. The Heatherwood Safe Routes to School and Walk and Roll Committees are comprised of parents, and they ask that you drive a little slower and more cautious around our school property. Please send a note to your child's teacher when they will be changing plans when going home, call the attendance line when your child is going to be absent, and sign your child out in the office when taking them out of school. Also, please read the Heatherwood Handbook which will be sent home soon for many other reminders on school procedures and safety precautions and the Heatherwood Communication Agreements created by our staff and SAC/PTO members.

Our custodians, Jim, Mary and David worked this summer to make our school clean and ready for teachers and students. They are doing a great job preparing to have the building clean and safe for the arrival of our children.

I am energized after twelve years at Heatherwood by children who want to attend school here in a safe environment, teachers who are dedicated to their profession and parents who work hard to support our school community to make it a positive learning environment for all of our children.

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Community members,

Volunteering in schools is a wonderful, beneficial experience that rewards not only the students and the teachers, but also the volunteers themselves. It provides an opportunity to create positive relationships and support schools in succeeding in their overall goal of student achievement.

Heatherwood understands it is our responsibility to ensure the safety of our students. To promote a safe, nurturing, and supportive educational environment in which students can pursue their educational goals, Heatherwood will maintain a background screening program for regularly scheduled volunteers as part of the approval process for volunteering in school activities and events. Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, all regular volunteers will be required to complete the background screening program each year prior to volunteering that year.

The BVSD volunteer background screening program will be maintained by a company called TLogiQ. The information obtained from the background screening will be used for the sole purpose of determining eligibility of volunteering in Boulder Valley School District and will not be shared or given to any other agency. Any information obtained will remain confidential and will be viewed only by the BVSD Human Resources Department. Once a volunteer is approved through the online screening program, he/she will be approved to volunteer at any (non-charter) school within BVSD during that school year.

Adults requesting to be considered regular volunteers in BVSD must complete an online background screening at the following website: www.tcllogiq.com/bvsdv. The cost of the background screen is \$16.00 plus applicable state fees. Any activity/field trip or any other activity where the volunteer is required to drive students will be required to pay \$22.50. This cost includes a regular volunteer background screening as well as a motor vehicle background screening. The fee will be paid to TLogiQ by the volunteer at the time he/she goes online to initiate a background screen. TLogiQ will accept payment through the online payment service Authorized.Net - MasterCard, Visa, Discover, and American Express are accepted. Other forms of payment are also accepted and can be arranged through TLogiQ.

Volunteer required to drive for activity/field trip or any other activity – Cost \$22.50

- This cost includes a regular volunteer background screening as well as a motor vehicle background screening

Regular volunteers required to complete the background screening program include, but are not limited to, those who help in the following activities – Cost \$16.00:

- Volunteers with a regular schedule in the school (classroom, health room, playground, cafeteria, library, greeters)
- Activity/Club mentor, volunteer or chaperone
- TAG (Talented and Gifted) mentor, volunteer or chaperone
- Field trips (no driving required of volunteer)
- Overnight trip chaperone
- At-Home (Student Contact) (ex. host of team dinner, building parade float)
- Volunteer coach (interscholastic or intramural)
- Volunteer attending field trip off school site
- Crossing guard

Occasional volunteers will not be required to complete the online background screening program. The school staff will conduct a minimal background screening for those individuals as appropriate. This category includes, but is not limited to, those who help in the following activities – No Cost: (You must get Principal approval for this volunteer classification)

- Occasional volunteer (ex. classroom party, school/community event)
 - School-sponsored events (ex. career fairs, book fairs, after-prom, science fairs, school dances, guest speakers, field day, registrations)
 - Projects with little or only incidental contact w/students (ex. fundraisers, boosters, concession stands, scorekeepers)
- School Accountability Committees/School Improvement Teams, the District Accountability Committee, District Parent Council, PTOs, PTAs, and PEN participants

We appreciate your cooperation and support of this new expanded background screening program. We share with you the priority to ensure the welfare and safety of our students. Please contact the school office or BVSD Human Resources with any questions you may have regarding this program.

Heatherwood Preschool Info

Preschool will be held at Heatherwood from Tuesday to Friday. The morning session is 8:00-10:45 am and the afternoon session is 11:45-2:30 pm. Tuition is \$355 per month. There is scholarship monies available also, if the cost is a hardship.

Children must be three years old by September 30, 2011 to attend. They can attend as three and four year olds.

There are a minimum of three adults per class (teacher plus two paraprofessionals) for 16 students per class and there are often other adults/ service providers in class well.

They get to do all of that fun stuff in the classroom such as PE, Music, Art and Library time. The classes are organized by a nationally-recognized, developmentally appropriate curriculum that teaches pre-literacy and pre-math and so much more in a fun, play-based environment.

You will receive several packets of information the first days of school. It is very important that you look the information over closely and return the forms by the deadlines. The free and reduced lunch application will not be sent home in these packets, you must pick the application up from the office.

Class Lists and Bus Routes

Class lists will be posted near the school's entrance on Friday, August 12 at 12:30 pm. Bus routes and schedules will be posted in the same area.

Attendance

Please call the attendance line at 720-561-5276 before 8:00 am if your student will be absent or tardy for the day. This number is a 24 hour recording so you can leave a message at any time. If you know in advance your child will be absent, please notify the office and the teacher of the dates and reason for the absence. If you do not call the attendance line with the reason for a student's absence by 8:30 am, you will receive an automated call generated from the district.

If your student arrives after the five minute tardy bell, please sign them in on the sign in sheet in the entry way. Failure to sign in may result in your student being marked absent for the entire school day.

After School Plans

Remember, if your student would like to ride home on another bus with a student, they **MUST** bring a signed permission slip from a parent to the office. Phone calls will not be permitted for making after school arrangements. Bus drivers cannot allow a student on the bus without the signed permission slip authorized by the office.

Appointments during School Hours

If your student has a dental or medical appointment during the school day, please plan enough time to park at the school, sign the student out at the office and go to the classroom to pick up the student. With the open space environment, we cannot call students over the intercom to the office to wait for parent pick up.
