BOULDER COUNTY YOUTH CORPS

Application Deadline: Friday, March 30

Boulder County residents ages 14-17 can now apply for summer jobs with the Youth Corps. The Youth Corps offers one of the best first job opportunities available in Boulder County. Up to 160 teenagers will be hired to work 30 hours a week, Monday through Thursday, from June 18 to August 8 on a variety of community service projects. Projects will include such activities as thinning forests, building trails, constructing fences and doing historic preservation and landscaping. Corpsmembers will earn a starting hourly wage of \$7.64, with the possibility of earning a \$100 bonus at the end of the program based on merit and strong attendance.
