The Campaign for Summit  
**Strong Bodies, Strong Minds**

Thanks to all of you who have generously supported the Campaign for Summit, our capital campaign to build a gym. We want to answer a few questions we have heard several of you ask.

**When will the gym be finished?**

We are working with the architects now on a timeline that completes the gym in December 2009 and we expect that will happen.

**Why do we have to pay for the gym? Why isn't the District paying for it?**

In our charter of 2006, BVSD agreed to pay at least \$4 million in "hard costs" for Phase 1 construction, which we used to build the library, additional classrooms and make needed changes to the existing building. Summit is a charter school with BVSD as our chartering authority. Districts in Colorado are not required to include charter schools in district bond projects; however, the district agreed to include Summit (and other charter schools such as Horizons and Peak to Peak). The district included Summit in the first phase, but in return, they required that Summit agree to build a gym. The main reason the district required this of Summit was because they had agreed to put significant dollars into Summit-specific renovations to the building which they would have no use for if Summit or another charter school were not housed there. The district wanted to make sure Summit was committed to staying at the site after they invested their dollars. The Summit Board at that time agreed that it was a good trade to raise the \$1 million for a much-needed gym in return for \$4 million (plus soft costs) from the district for Phase 1. The \$4 million committed to Summit is much higher than the amount received by any other charter school. Additionally, all unused public bond money (hard costs) from Phase 1 will go to Phase 2.

Admittedly, this is a difficult time for families to make an additional commitment to Summit financially and we are very appreciative of all those who do, and understand that there are those who can't at this time. We have raised approximately \$450,000 from families whose children attended Summit in prior years. Another \$550,000 has come from families who have students at Summit in 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grades now. Furthermore, most districts in the state have not included charter schools in general bond issues and we are grateful for all of the resources BVSD has allocated to Summit and other charter schools.

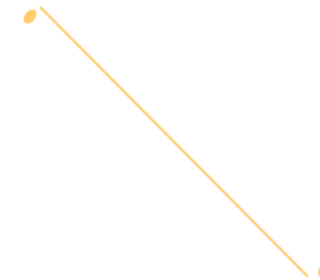

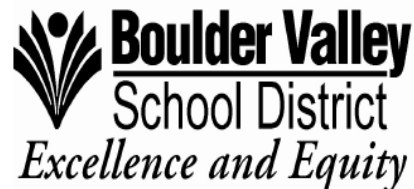

### ENROLLMENT IN SUMMIT

Summit Middle School is a tuition-free, public charter school in the Boulder Valley School District, serving grades 6, 7 and 8 through mixed-age classes grouped by ability, interest, motivation, developmental level, and mastery of previous material - taught by teachers who are specialists in their subject areas. Prospective students register through the District's open-enrollment process at the beginning of the calendar year.
