

## **Standardized Test Scores**

Each year Summit students take the Colorado Student Assessment Program (CSAP) and the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP). Summit consistently ranks among the top of the state's approximately 300 public middle schools in every subject in every grade. For many years Summit has received the highest CSAP scores of any school in the Boulder Valley School District. For 2010 the percentages of students scoring *proficient* or *advanced* are shown in the table below.

The computer-based MAP tests, which Summit (alone in the Boulder Valley School District) administers, provide some additional positive data: 1) the Math and Language Usage tests students take at Summit corroborate the high achievement shown on CSAP, with fully 96-99% of students demonstrating Proficient grade-level performance, and 2) the students' scores demonstrate that even these high-performing students are continuing to grow substantially from year to year. NWEA, the organization that provides the MAP tests, defines any school or classroom in which 60% or more of the students meet individualized growth goals as "a high growth" environment. Summit students meet these criteria at all grades and in all subjects.

### **What Do Parents Say?**

In the Boulder Valley School District's most recent parent satisfaction surveys, parents responded that they felt Summit was very effective in all areas: student learning, quality of staff, asset management, continuous improvement, collaboration, and promoting understanding. Fully 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that "Summit classes provide a solid foundation for student learning," and 99% agreed or strongly agreed that "their children felt safe at Summit".

All in all, these data from tests and parent feedback support what Summit teachers and parents observe every day: Summit students not only achieve at a very high level but they also continue to grow and strive for excellence year after year.
